

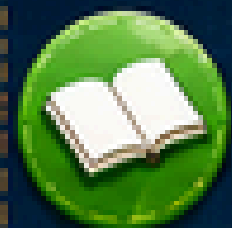

Mammoths lived during the Ice Age, about 2.6 million to 4,000 years ago. They roamed across cold places like North America, Europe, Asia, and parts of Africa. They liked wide, open grasslands and snowy plains.

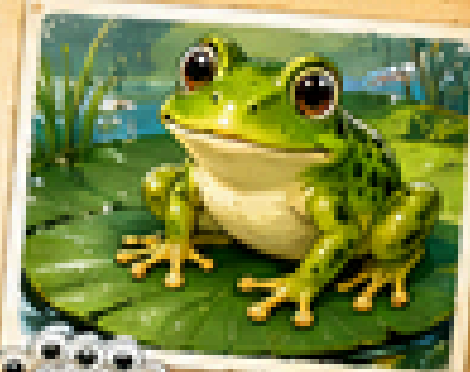

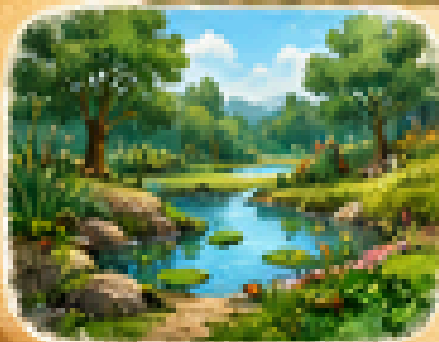

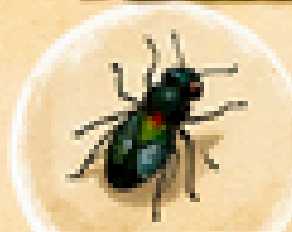
Where It Lives


Let's Learn About the ZEBRA!

Tigers can run up to 60 km/h! That's super fast!



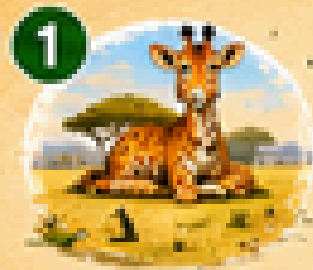
Let's Learn About the GIRAFFE!

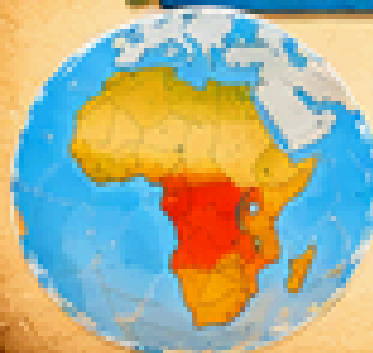

Meet the Deer

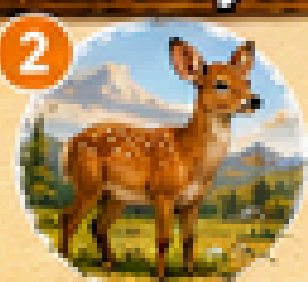

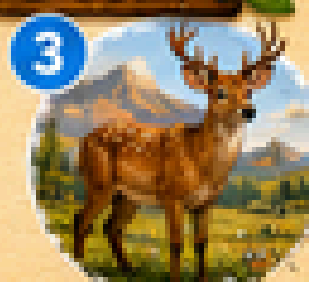

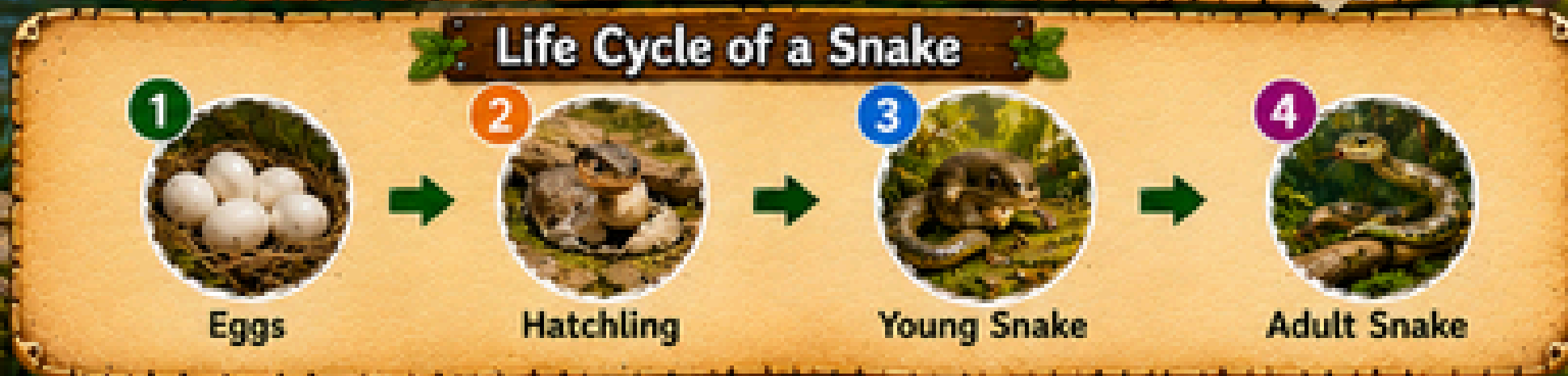


Let's Learn About the SNAKE!

Meet the Elephant

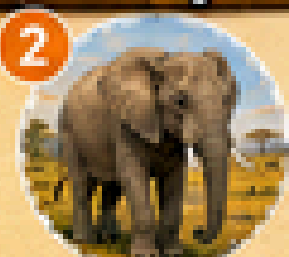

Meet the Lizard

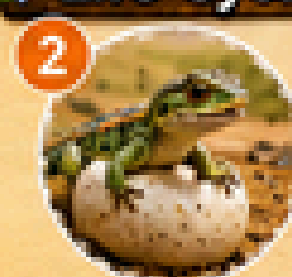

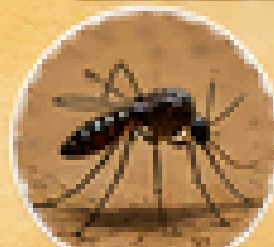
Where It Lives

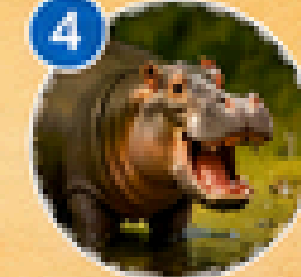

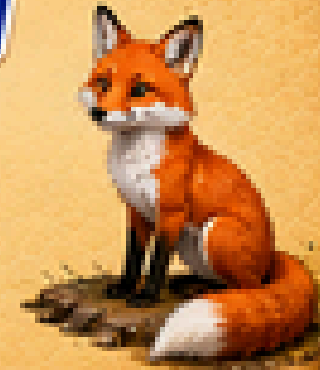
